WHY MENTORING?

The AMT Mentoring program is designed to enable early career massage therapists to engage in professional conversation with a mentor; improve personal and communication skills, plan for professional growth and development and the success of your career.

The program aims to:

- * assist early career massage therapists with personal development, business development and improved understanding of the practice of massage therapy
- * support massage therapists as they adjust to, and navigate, their new career
- * provide mentors with an opportunity to grow their own skills and attributes, and give back to the profession
- * encourage and support each massage therapist to achieve to their full potential

This program is delivered by AMT and supported by *Art of Mentoring*, a specialist mentoring consultancy which provides a specialist on-line platform for the program. We also acknowledge the sponsorship of **Fenton Green & Co**, an organisation which offers a combined professional indemnity and public & products liability insurance policy for massage therapists. WHAT DO WE MEAN BY MENTORING?

mentor: (noun) an experienced and trusted adviser.

Mentorship is a developmental relationship in which one person, usually more experienced or senior, takes time to assist the career, professional or personal development of someone else, who is known as a mentee, mentoree, or protégé. Mentoring is most often a one-on-one relationship but is sometimes done in groups.

A mentoring relationship is one that is built on trust, in which there is an exchange of knowledge, experience and goodwill.

Some examples of what our mentors may assist with include:

- Act as a source of information and insight
- Suggest relevant options regarding career development or strategies for achieving career goals
- Recommend possible resources to improve specific skills
- Help the mentee solve professional challenges in their working life
- Discuss issues of professional ethics
- Discuss workplace related issues and options for how these may be addressed

BENEFITS OF THE PROGRAM

For Mentees:

For AMT

The Association of Massage Therapists wishes to support early career massage therapists as they transition into the industry. We see the value of finding a personal reflective space away from the busy-ness of your work; a conversational space which stimulates your thinking and helps you develop clearer insights into your questions, issues and plans. Mentoring can build an organisational culture of trust and excellence and can impact in a positive way on your career plans and longevity in your chosen field, which in turn benefits our Association.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To join as a **mentee**, you should be either a student nearing the completion of training, or in your first three years of working as a massage therapist.

To join as a **mentor**, you should have at least five years' experience in the industry, and a willingness to journey alongside an early career professional as they 'find their feet' as a massage therapist.

Both mentees and mentors must also be willing to complete the training provided, attend program webinars and complete surveys from time to time.

Application Process

Mentees and mentors will be asked to complete a short application form online to assess their eligibility for the program and to collect details about what they are looking for in a mentoring partner.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Acceptance into the program is conditional upon your completing the on-line training prior to filling in your application form. The *Art of Mentoring* training prepares mentees and mentors for their mentoring relationship. This training will take around 90 minutes and can be completed in stages – your progress is saved each time you log-in.

Mentors and mentees will be matched according to application details. We are utilising a virtual e-mentoring program, hosted by *Art of Mentoring*, which means that we can match mentees with mentors from across Australia, regardless of where you are located. Rather, participants will be matched based on skill sets and desired learning outcomes.

Participants might choose to meet via skype or over the phone. Where mentors and mentees wish to enter into a face-to-face mentoring relationship we will do our best to match you with someone close to you within close proximity to your location. You should be prepared however for electronic communication.

As this pilot program is of six months duration, mentors and mentees will be expected to be in contact a minimum of once per month. We know that best results would be achieved if you commit to meeting twice per month for the first three months, or an average of every three weeks overall.

You will also be required to attend three events - Program Launch, Mid-Program Review and Program Close – all of which will be delivered via Webinars.

During the program you will receive frequent communications from AMT, giving you helpful tips and information about mentoring and access to other relevant materials available for supporting mentees.

You will be invited to provide feedback to AMT at various times about your experience. You will be asked to complete several short surveys and a reflection piece.

PROGRAM MATERIALS

All the materials you need will be available for you online.

When you register you will have access to the initial training materials and the application form. You can move between completing the training and filling in the application form. Progress is saved for each.

The online program administration platform will allow you to communicate with the program coordinator, and access resources.

There is no cost attached to the pilot program however there may be a charge for a future cohort.

WHAT DO I DO NEXT?

Complete your registration and get started on the training, and then your application.

Submit your online application by **20 September 2018**. Mentees will be asked questions about their background, and what they would like to achieve by working with a mentor for six months. Mentors will be asked about the areas in which they feel comfortable mentoring.

Please give as much information as you reasonably can as it will assist the matching process.

AMT will match mentors and mentees and advise you of your match, or let you know if you are on a waiting list. You will be advised if there is a suitable match by 5 October 2018.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I AM NOT SELECTED?

We will endeavour to match all mentees who apply, provided that we have a suitable mentor. Some mentors may not be matched if their expertise/ experience is not suitable for any applicants. If we don't have a suitable match for a mentee or mentor, we won't pair you for the sake of putting you in the program at this time.

CODE OF PRACTICE

To make the mentoring experience as successful as possible for both Mentor and Mentee, we ask that you please follow and abide by the [Association of Massage Therapists' Code of Conduct](#). The following guidelines apply directly to our Mentoring Program. See also the *Art of Mentoring* Code of Practice.

Show respect to your Mentor/Mentee and maintain professional conduct at all times:

- the AMT encourages discussions and exchange of ideas regarding personal experience and professional growth in the massage therapy industry; mentoring is not a skills-based teaching or training program.
- harassment, discrimination, threatening or abusive behaviour will not be tolerated. Respect the beliefs, rights, values, and point of view of others.
- do not disclose, share, duplicate or distribute each other's personal information without consent
- keep your mentoring relationship and social media posts quite separate
- be honest when you present issues and be respectful in all your responses
- topics discussed by mentors and mentees may of a sensitive or controversial nature and may involve personal opinion; strict confidentiality must be maintained between mentors and mentees
- check that your comments and sense of humour are appreciated - tasteless statements or jokes are to be avoided
- keep relationships free of romantic or sexual involvement or innuendo
- unauthorised commercial activity is prohibited; posting or transmitting unauthorised or unsolicited advertising, promotional materials, or any other forms of solicitation is not allowed
- the program is not intended to be used a recruitment tool and there should be no expectation of employment being provided as an outcome
- ongoing concerns regarding an ethical or unsafe practice issue should be referred in the first instance to AMT Head Office.
- the Mentoring Program utilises the services and resources of *Art of Mentoring*; these are for your personal use only while you are associated with the AMT Mentoring Program. Do not break copyright.
- refrain from conduct that adversely affects the reputation of the Association of Massage Therapists or the massage profession

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How long will the mentor program run for?

The pilot mentor program will run for a little over six months from 8 October 2018 to 29 April 2019.

Who is this program open to?

The program is open to all members of AMT provided they meet the eligibility criteria.

What's the cost?

Mentors and mentees pay no fee for this pilot program. A fee may apply to a rollout to AMT members in the future.

How do I apply?

Why do you need me to provide so much information on my application form?

The information you provide will help us 'match' the right mentee with the right mentor, based on experience, skills and what you both want to achieve from the program.

When will I know if I've been successful, and if so, who I've been matched with?

Once you have completed your application, we will contact you to confirm whether you've been accepted into the program and who has been selected as your mentoring partner. It's important to note we won't 'match for matching sake'. You should hear from us on 5 October 2018 as to whether your application has been successful.

What will I have to do if my application is successful?

If your application is successful, you will need to attend the Program Launch webinar, Progress Review webinar, Program Close webinar (please refer to the dates earlier in this document) and to engage in a mentoring partnership for a period of around six months. It will be up to each mentee/mentor pair to establish their own timetables and agenda for their one-on-one meetings, which would probably take place at least monthly for the program duration.

Will discussions between mentees and mentors be confidential?

Absolutely! Great mentee/mentor relationships are based first and foremost on trust. Your participation in the program is confidential and you will agree with your mentoring partner how you will handle confidentiality between you.
